## Planning Application R/2023/0253/RMM, Energy Recovery Facility, Prairie Site, Grangetown

Comments similar to our comments regarding application R/2023/0246/RMM apply also to this application.

As stated in application R/2023/0253/RMM this is a reserved matters submission under outline planning permission R/2019/0767/OOM. R/2019/0767/OOM had a pre-commencement archaeological condition attached, now complied with in relation to site work *and* written assessment\* of the significance of the remains found.

(\*Although the condition is still to be complied with in terms of publication of the archaeological discoveries made, in an format accessible to the general public, a matter which should be the subject of continuing discussion and agreement with the LPA. A publication that covers other remains of the Iron and Steel Industry within the STDC area yet to be reported on - e.g., the Redcar Iron works, on the Long Acres Site - together with the ERF site, has been proposed by the STDC archaeological adviser and accepted in principle.)

Recommendation: If the facility as proposed is constructed, the location of the archaeological remains the subject of the completed investigation will not be publicly accessible, and are not of such significance as would merit preservation *in situ*. We would also add that a strip, map and record having already taken place ahead of construction work/regrading in the archaeologically important part of the site, a watching brief during construction works on this already degraded landscape is not considered necessary. If planning permission is to be granted for the current application therefore we would recommend that no further archaeological mitigation or archaeological conditions are required.
